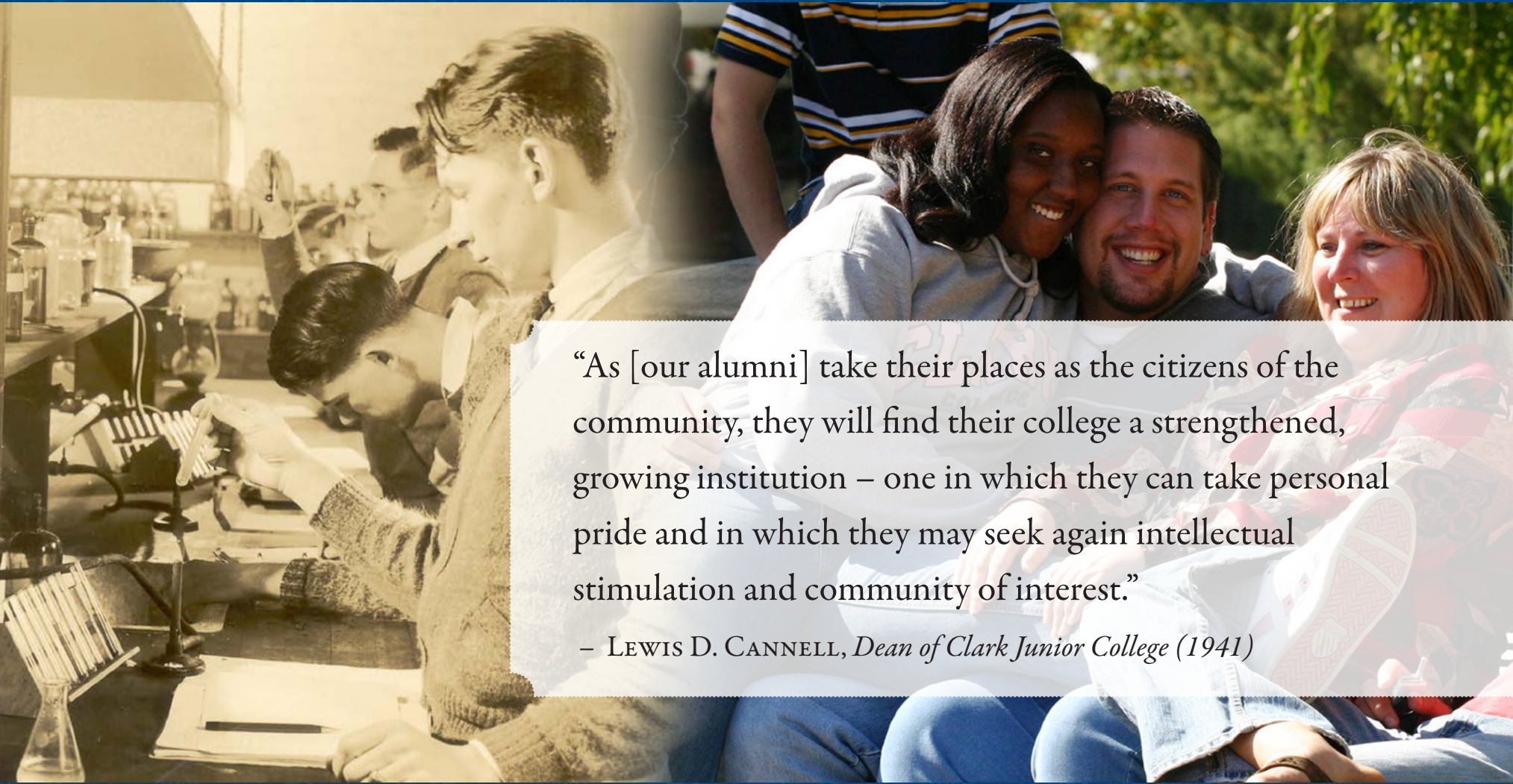

# Our Students

## 1933-1934

Vancouver Junior College, as it was originally known, welcomed fewer than 20 students when it opened for classes on October 2, 1933. (On November 18, following a contest, it was announced that the name would be changed to Clark Junior College.) One student, Mrs. Frances Bunnell Wilde, was the first and only graduate in 1934. Mrs. Wilde was honored at what Clark Junior College called its “first all-school banquet and dance” at the Castle Grill in Vancouver.

## 2007-2008

Clark College welcomed more than 21,000 students throughout the year, including 752 in the Running Start program. During the 2007-2008 academic year, 1,129 Clark College students earned 1,252 associate degrees and certificates. Clark College welcomed author and screenwriter Sherman Alexie as guest speaker at the college’s 2008 commencement ceremony, which was held at The Amphitheater at Clark County in Ridgefield.

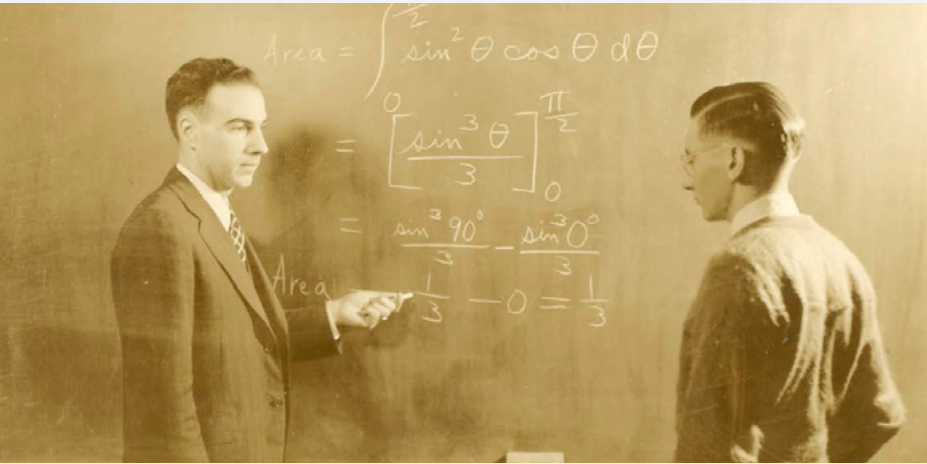
## 2007-2008

During the 2007-2008 academic year, Clark College students were taught by 200 full-time faculty members and 530 adjunct faculty members. In addition, 276 classified staff members and 75 administrators served students and community members in areas including Administrative Services, Communications and Marketing, Corporate and Continuing Education, Human Resources, Planning and Effectiveness, and Student Affairs.





# Our Programs



## 1933-1934

As it announced plans to open, the college proudly proclaimed that its School of Liberal Arts would provide classes in English, mathematics, history and economics, foreign languages, social science and physical education. The School of Fine Arts offered classes in piano, voice, violin, cello, speech arts and dramatics. The college also offered a School of Business Administration.

## 2007-2008

Clark College offers 121 degrees and certificates – in programs ranging from health sciences and computer technology to culinary arts and automotive or diesel technology. Clark students can earn associate degrees in arts, applied science, and applied technology. In addition, students can earn certificates of achievement, completion and proficiency. Clark College also offers classes in adult basic education and English as a Second Language.

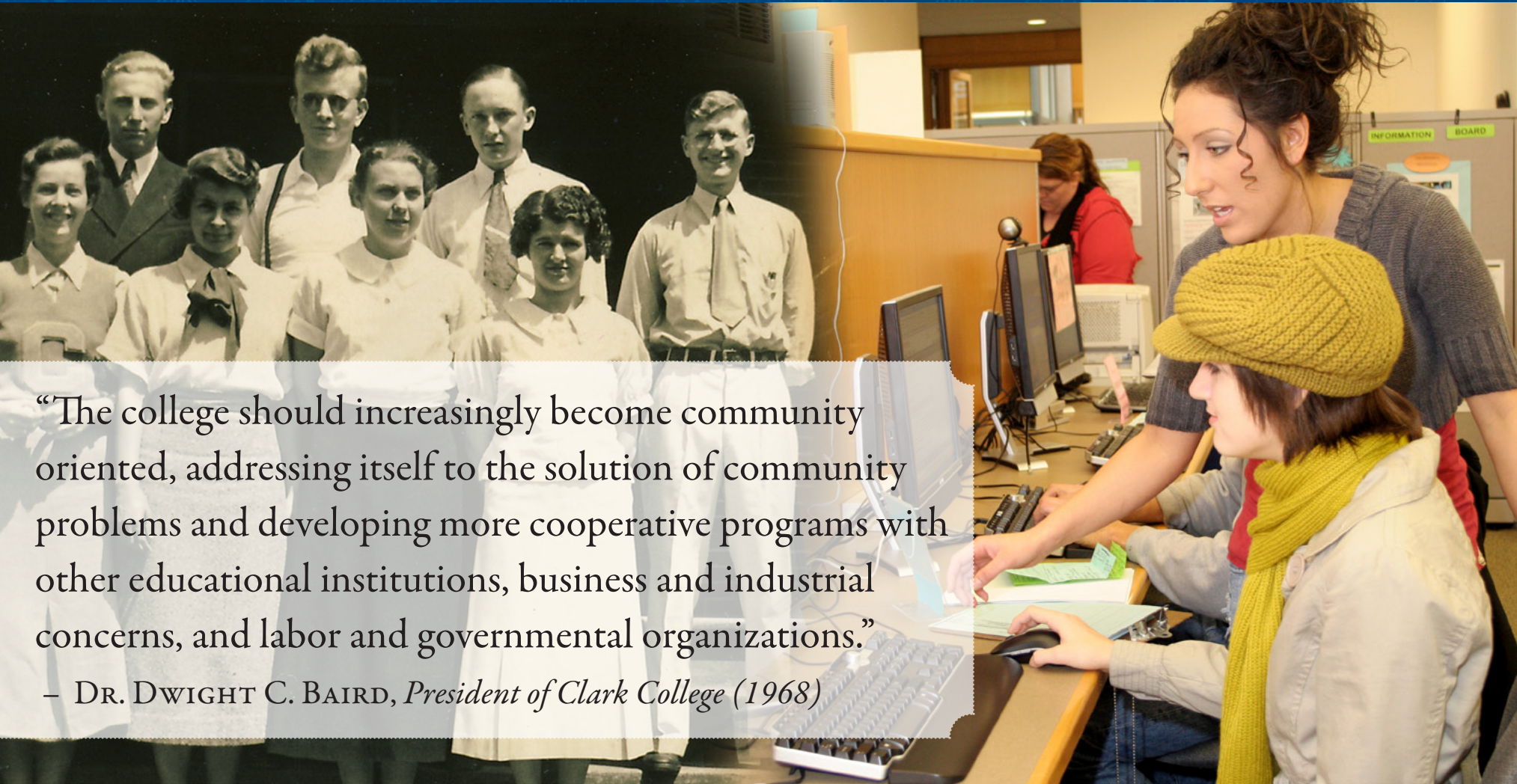

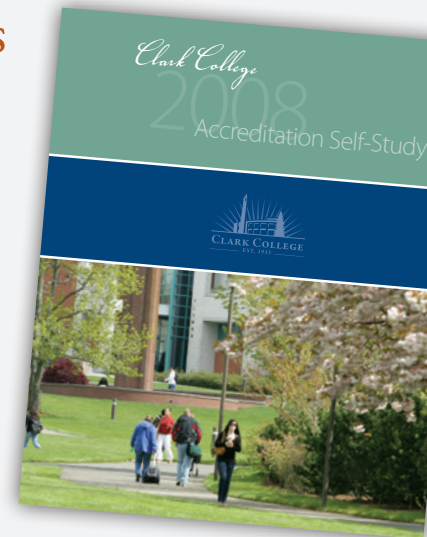
As a result, it was announced on April 23, 1937, that Clark Junior College had been accredited for one year.

## 1937: The college's first accreditation

The goal of accreditation is to ensure the quality of education provided by institutions of higher education. At the invitation of the college, a committee of five professors from the University of Washington visited Clark on March 12, 1937. Historians note that, while the college facilities were meager, the committee members were impressed by the quality of the work being done by the faculty. As

## 2008: The college's accreditation is reaffirmed

From October 8-10, 2008, the college hosted an accreditation visit by educators from the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU). The visit, which followed a two-year self-study by the college, resulted in reaffirmation of the college's accreditation. Since its first accreditation in 1937, Clark College has remained accredited throughout its history.





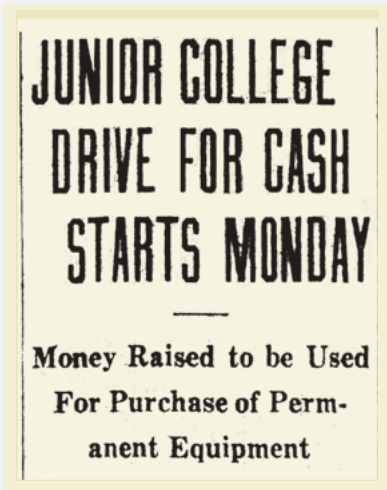

## 1934: Seeking community support

In the fall of 1934, Clark Junior College announced plans to raise \$5,000 to buy permanent equipment, including chemical laboratory supplies, library books, chairs, blackboards and other necessities. Years later, Dean Robert Oliver recalled that only about \$30 was raised.

## 2008: Supported by a strong foundation

The Clark College Foundation was established in 1973 to bridge the gap between state funding provisions and the college's aspirations for its students and future.

In the 2007-2008 academic year, over 140 scholarship funds gave more than 310 students the boost they needed to take The Next Step on their educational path for a total of nearly \$450,000. Another \$750,000 was made possible through existing endowments and new contributions for 30 innovative projects and seven permanently funded grants at Clark College.
